EVENTS AND WORKSHOPS

PAGE TO STAGE - Available to schools and groups

A *Page to Stage* is unique to the production offering this event and would be led by the resident company of actors and/or touring manager. It is an opportunity to understand a production in greater detail by working through the rehearsal process. They bring set texts to life, exploring the practical necessities of theatrical production from a professional perspective and focusing on direction, interpretation, themes, key moments and spatial, visual and aural issues. These events can be tailored to the needs of your students but in the main they are aimed at Key Stage 3 and above. Although these events can vary in length they normally take place in the auditorium prior to a mid-week matinee show. Pre-booking is required and a charge is usually attached.

QUESTION AND ANSWER - Available to schools and groups

A *Question and Answer* event offers you the chance to speak with experts you would not usually have the opportunity to contact. Usually held directly after the midweekmatinee performance in the auditorium, they last approximately half an hour and involve members of the visiting company. The format involves some introduction from the chair and then questions from the floor or from pre-question forms which would have been sent out to bookers to fill in, in advance of the event. These events are normally free of charge but we advise you to book your place prior to the day of the event.

PRE/POST PERFORMANCE TALKS & DISCUSSIONS - Open to all

To heighten your theatre-going experience even more with a little extra knowledge. A *Pre-Performance Talk* gives an audience an insight into the production they are about to watch, with a brief description of the narrative, production history, information regarding the production company and highlight key moments to look out for.

A *Post-Performance Talk* gives an audience the opportunity to ask questions of the cast and creative team of the show they have just seen. The format involves some introduction from the chair and then questions from the floor.

These events both last approximately half an hour and are normally free of charge but you may be asked to book in advance for some pre-performance talks.

Note: occasionally due to location, tickets can be limited.

MEET & GREET- Available to schools and groups

A *Meet & Greet* is an opportunity for you and your group to meet performers and discover more about them and their production. Not all production companies offer this activity. These events can be held either pre- or post-performance and are normally free of charge but you must make arrangements in advance through the education department.

PRODUCTION-AFFILIATED WORKSHOPS - Various availability

To enhance and add educational value in visiting the theatre, *Production-affiliated Workshops* are unique to each production offering them and are aimed primarily at schools and groups but sometimes are open to individuals. They often can be tailored to your needs and a charge is usually attached to them.

TEACHER INSET - Available to teachers and teaching assistants only

Teacher INSET's (or Continuing Professional Development) are occasionally offered by visiting companies and each is unique to that production. Each INSET aims to allow you to take away fresh ideas and techniques to put into practice in the classroom. The majority of these sessions are practical and teachers are advised to wear loose, comfortable clothing which they can move in. There is a usually a charge per teacher and places are limited and on a first come first served basis. Places are only available by registering your interest with the NTR Education Department.

TECHNICAL PRODUCTION EVENT - Open to all

This event offers ticket-holders an opportunity to gain a deeper and richer understanding of how a production is technically put together. Timetabled for after the midweek matinee it is suitable for school groups with tickets to see the performance, whether they have already seen the show or are going to see the show.

Members of the technical team provide both an informative talk and practical demonstration about how the production is put together. Technicians will be on stage to demonstrate lighting effects and flying of scenery from the production (if applicable) and it will provide ticket-holders with an appreciation of the production at a different level, including an understanding of the making of a show. This is a free event and places are only available by registering your interest with the NTR Education Department.

BALLET REVEALED (Northern Ballet) - Open to all

This event is an opportunity to find out more about the production, the company and then watch the dancers' daily training session on stage. BR is open to those attending an Northern Ballet performance. Although not suitable for all school groups there are a limited number of spaces reserved for small groups of students with a relevant interest in dance. There is a charge for this event and you can purchase tickets through the Box Office or NTR Education Department.

LIMELIGHTERS ~ Over 50's Workshop

Workshops with an affiliated dance teacher who will run through ideas from the associated production, highlighting specific illustrations and choreographed segments related to it. The workshop consists of a gentle warm-up, followed by individual creative work, based on the production. These sessions are suitable for complete beginners, and also those who have some dance experience. *Further details in the DANCE section of this Newsletter*

Q&As, Talks & Discussions

Unless stated, these events are open to all Key Stages. However some of these events may require pre-booking. Please contact NTR Education Department if further information is required.

NORWICH THEATRE ROYAL THEATRE ACCESS PROJECT **NORSE** GROUP

Norwich Theatre Royal launched the **Theatre Access Project (T.A.P.)** in September 2011. With Norse sponsorship we have been able to subsidise the cost of a theatre visit with funding towards tickets and/or travel for **30** schools who have not had a relationship with Norwich Theatre Royal in recent years. From September 2012, the theatre's education department has extended the project's reach to include **100** primary schools in Norfolk.

In terms of figures there has been an overwhelming take-up of the subsidised tickets, with over 3000 schoolchildren benefitting from a theatre visit. It's been fantastic working with local Primary Schools to bring their students to see over 12 different productions, including *Horrible Histories, Swallows & Amazons* and *Sister Act*. We will continue to build on these relationships and examine the effect the Theatre Access Project has had for the participants. We hope the groups who have been offered this opportunity found their theatre visits and subsequent sessions useful and fun.

Our findings so far have highlighted the positive effect of T.A.P. One teacher noted; "It's an opportunity for young people to see theatre in the raw; to get an understanding of what happens behind the scenes; to get used to sitting in an auditorium and enjoying a performance; sitting still is part of it so you don't spoil it for anyone else. It's a wonderful experience."

The project so far has been extremely effective in engaging the pupils with high quality theatrical experiences and providing exclusive opportunities to add educational value to a visit; drawing from a wide range of production teams, resources and associated events/workshops/activities. The measured outcomes of a theatre experience can demonstrate increased knowledge of story and writing skills, improved listening skills, discipline, cultural awareness, developing self-esteem and enabling the teachers in the classroom.
