



10:00 - 11:30	NNR	'Naturally Nurturing Remediation Strategies'	Join Elisa Ferriggi, Think Autism Ltd and discover how to tailor interactions so that your child will learn to think for themselves, feel competent in interactions and get results in your interactions. In this action packed session you'll learn: • Simple, low energy things that you can do to change the communication cycle between you and your child. • Strategies to more meaningful interaction exchanges with your child. • How to help your child process information effectively • The importance of remediation Vs. compensation. • View all behavior as communication. • How to tailor interactions so that your child will learn to think for him or her self, feel competent in interactions and be more emotionally connected in interactions. • Recognise subtle signs of stress, in order to consider environmental and lifestyle changes to reduce stress now and individualise task challenges. Understand how attention determines learning outcomes. Parents can enhance their child's learning experience by understanding behaviour as communication and adapt their approach to achieve optimum interactions, improving quality of life now and in the future for child and the whole family.
10:15 – 11:15	VIS	'Visual Support'	This session, delivered by Daphne Rowlands, Children Autism Services, will look at how Visual strategies could make a significant difference in a child's ability to understand communication better. Daphne will discuss various ways of presenting visual support, demonstrate ways of making them and talk about situations when their use may be beneficial for the child, parent, carer or professional. Showing examples, she will talk through how you could use them in different situations.

10:15 – 11:15	MCA	'Mental Capacity Act'	This session delivered by Emma Farrar from The Professional Deputy Service will look at mental capacity and the law and how to make decisions and manage people's money who lack capacity.			
11:45 – 12:30	EQA	'The Equality Act and schools - what it means for your child'	Kim Barber, Norfolk County Council Children's Services will talk about the responsibilities of schools in relation to the Equality Act. She will also talk about how schools can meet the needs of pupils with an ASD and ensure that their practices are inkeeping with the Equality Act.			
11:45 – 12:45	MOV	'Moving – On from one school to another'	If your son or daugheter is moving-on from one school phase to another, whether this is from Pre-school to Infant/prmary or Infant to Junior or Primary/Junior to Secondary, Anne Ebbage, Autism Anglia will give tips to finding an autism friendly school and how to aid transition.			
11:45 – 12:45	AAH	'Accessing Acute hospitals'	Sally Ryan (Ipswich Hospital) Paul Hunter (West Suffolk Hospital) and Rebecca Crossley (James Paget Hospital) are all Learning Disabilities Liaison Nurses working within acute hospitals and have responsibility for overseeing and co-ordinating the implementation of the autism strategy within their individual Trusts. Additionally they are responsible for supporting the reasonable adjustments necessary to ensure equality of access to hospitals for people with autism. Together they will provide this information session on their roles and what they are doing to support accessibility of services.			
13:15 – 14:30	МСВ	'Managing Challenging Behaviour'	This session, delivered by Julie Adcock from ASD Helping Hands, will look at: What is challenging behaviour; Triggers and effect of sensory issues; The Anger mountain and understanding the behaviour; Deescalation techniques			
13:15 – 14:15	SOC	'Social Stories'	Delivered by Daphne Rowlands, Children Autism Services, this session will look at how Social Stories can be used as a tool for teaching social skills to children with autism. Daphne will talk about the concept behind social stories, and showing examples, she will talk through when to use them, how you could use them in different situations, and different ways of presenting them.			

13:15 – 13:45	SHW	'Working with Autism'	The content of this session delivered by Mark Craven, Team Leader LDDF & Suffolk Mental Health Projects, SHAW TRUST, will cover an overview of the Shaw Trust and their Suffolk contracts, how they work and success stories of clients on the Autistic spectrum.
14:00 – 15:00	CJS	'Autism & the Criminal Justice System'	This session delivered by Alan Bicknell, Deputy Chief Exec, Autism Anglia, will look at why people with Autism can have contact with the criminal justice system & strategies for supporting them when they do.
14:30 – 15:30	INC	'Informed Choices - saying No is good!'	We all make choices about what we do, where we live, who we live with, where we work, who we socialise with, and where we have fun. There is a perception that says that people with disabilities should accept every opportunity offered them, Norfolk Charity BUILD disagrees. This session, delivered by BUILD's Chief Executive, James Kearns, explores the processes for helping people make informed choices, and recognises that saying "NO" is equally as valuable as saying "YES"
14:45 – 15:45	WHV	'We Have a Voice'	Annie Clements, CEO Autism & ADHD We Have a Voice is a new mutli media platform working with Young People with Autism and ADHD. It allows them to explore their daily challenges and experiences through a range of mediums such as film, music and a magazine thus improving the knowledge and understanding of the communities they live in and increasing their opportunities to flourish to achieve. This session will give you more information about the project and how you can get involved and have an opportunity to listen and talk to some of the Young People that have been involved so far.
