Norwich can lay claim to be one of the earliest multicultural cities in Britain, the first big influx of 'strangers' arrived in the city in 1565 from the Spanish Netherlands as asylum seeking political refugees. They were welcomed by the city as a valuable addition to the population and a considerable boost to the burgeoning textile trade. At one point they accounted for over a third of the City's population.

The choir is now recruiting new members and hopes that, in keeping with the spirit of Norwich as the UK's first City of Refuge, people representing the current diverse cultural mix of the population will join.

And audiences need places where they can properly interact with the art or performance. Our Capital investment programme is a very practical way of helping to develop the arts infrastructure in this country so that organisations can flourish and continue to produce the excellent work that audiences want to see.

Capital Grant to Improve Arts & Culture Facilities (England)

Voluntary Action Fund (VAF) has announced that the final closing date for applications through its Community Chest Programme is the 14th January 2013. Community Chest can provide grants of up to £1,000 and free training to groups with an annual income under £25,000. Groups can apply for funding for a wide range of activities or operational costs. However, the VAF are particularly keen to fund activities that will help build and develop strong organisations. This can include:

- Training for committee members and volunteers
- Visits to other organisations or conferences
- Professional support or consultancy.

As part of Arts Council England's £234.6 million Capital investment programme, arts and culture organisations can now apply for grants between £100,000 and £499,999 to improve their existing arts facilities. £20 million is available for small capital grants to help organisations improve their existing buildings and equipment. There will be two funding rounds, with £12 million budgeted for 2012/13 and a further £8 million available in 2013/14. The Arts Council will prioritise applications from National portfolio-funded organisations, though organisations they do not currently fund are welcome to apply with prior written agreement. All applicants are advised to consult with their regional Arts Council office before applying.

Arts Council Launches Creative People & Places Fund Round II (England)

The Arts Council England has launched the second funding round of its Creative People and Places Fund. This is a new £37 million fund to help people living in places where involvement in the arts is significantly below the national average to participate in the arts. The Creative People and Places Fund will operate over three years. It will invest in around 15 programmes of activity that use radical new approaches to developing excellent, inspiring and sustainable arts experiences for communities not currently engaging with the arts. The Arts Council is keen to encourage long-term collaborations between local communities and arts organisations, museums, libraries and local authorities. The Arts Council anticipate that the majority of funds awarded will be for between £500,000 and £3 million over three years.

New cash for arts & technology projects

A new £7m fund for arts projects based in England will support new digital research and development projects that deal with expanding audience research and developing new business models. Applicants can be organisations running arts projects in collaboration with technology providers, regardless of whether they are currently working with a research partner. The scheme is also accepting applications from researchers interested in partnering with arts organisations and technology providers looking for research partners. ACE Arts Library Fund

The Grants for the arts Libraries fund will invest £6 million of the Arts Council's Grants for the arts National Lottery money in projects delivered by public libraries or library authorities working in partnership with cultural organisations across all art forms. It is hoped that the Grants for the arts Libraries fund will inspire ambitious, innovative partnerships between libraries and arts organisations, and encourage library users and those living locally to take part in artistic and cultural activities. Public libraries can apply for grants of between £1,000 and £100,000 covering activities lasting up to three years. The fund opened to applications on 27 September 2012 and will run until March 2015

IdeasTap, a non-for-profit initiative supports young creative people between 16 and 25 years of age, has announced that its Ideas Fund Innovators is open to applications. This is to ensure that the project reaches young people otherwise not engaged, and to ensure that the performance venue gains a full understanding of the aims of the project.
