Social Sciences

Research Skills

Drawing on the experiences of current undergraduates, this session will introduce students to research-led teaching and learning. Throughout the session we will explore what research is, why we undertake research and ways in which we can develop as researchers. The workshop will provide students with opportunities to develop and enhance their research skills and show them how to work with research to enable them to engage with and utilise current research in their studies.

Discover Philosophy

Discover Philosophy will give students a real sense of what philosophy is about, of its mind-boggling challenges and the unexpected perspectives it can give us. It will put students in touch with some of the exciting research done at UEA, and give them an idea of what it is like to study philosophy at our University. Leading researchers will deliver seminars and workshops showcasing a range of our teaching and research specialisms. These include work on unconscious judgement and decision-making; philosophy as film; environmental philosophy; philosophy of mind and philosophy of science. Students and lecturers will creatively engage with the pressing philosophical problems in today's world.

True Lies?: Creative Writing – Fact and Fiction

How is real life used in creative writing? Are there any times when real life shouldn't be used? Is fiction fictional? In this lively writing workshop students will discuss some of these issues and explore ways to negotiate them.

Witch Hunts in History

Everyone knows something about the witch hunts that plagued the early modern world. But how much is fact and how much fantasy? Using historical evidence, this session aims to get behind the myths to see why our ancestors were so worried about people believed to be agents of Satan.

What Makes a Good Work of Art?

'Do I like it?' and 'Is it any good?' are often our first responses to a work of art. But are such questions the best way of understanding what art is about? Are there ways of judging art (or indeed whether something qualifies as art) which transcend the personal or the individual? Drawing on the artistic resources of the Sainsbury Centre for Visual Arts, students will explore and evaluate various explanations - technical, historical and philosophical - of what makes a good work of art.

History: War, Sport and Music in Bosnia

During this event students will explore the impact that war has on society. By taking the example of Bosnia in the 1990s, students will look at how friendships, sport, music and other aspects of everyday life were changed by conflict. In particular students will focus on the siege of Sarajevo from 1992-95. No prior knowledge of events is required and there will be a chance to ask questions about this particular case study.

Adaptation

Discover Computing

Discover more about studying computing sciences at undergraduate level; explore available courses and meet our current students. During the day students will participate in a hands-on session and have the chance to explore the exciting research currently being undertaken by the School, including motion sensor and video games technology.

Blood and Blood Vessels

Our circulatory system stretches 60,000 miles and carries 10 pints of blood around our body helping to deliver oxygen to tissue and fight infection. The composition of human blood is complex with at least 9 different types of blood cell in circulation. This taster session will highlight some of the cardiovascular and biomedical research going on at UEA including how blood flow is controlled and how our own blood cells can turn against us and cause disease.

Story of Aspirin

An opportunity for students to explore practical applications of chemistry and the ground-breaking world of pharmaceuticals. Students will work alongside expert academics and current pharmacy students to discover the story of one of the most commonly used drugs. From synthesising aspirin to learning how the drug is made, this interactive day will offer students an insight into studying for a pharmacy degree, as well as the opportunity to experience teaching in our state of the art teaching labs.

Monday 17 December

Medicine and Health

This event offers prospective medics the opportunity to find out what it is really like to study this fascinating and challenging discipline. As well as exploring Problem Based Learning by working in groups on a diagnosis, students will also have the opportunity to get hands on in a practical session on CPR and First Aid to see if they have got what it takes to become a medic. There will also be opportunities to gain some advice on applying to study medicine and gaining work experience, aswell as take part in a Q&A session with current medical students and the Medical School Head of Admissions.
