'Call to Artists' for Norfolk & Norwich Open Studios 2013

Artist applications are open now and the deadline is Friday 14 December 2012. Each year hundreds of artists across the region invite the public into their private studios to reveal where and how they work. Run by Norfolk & Norwich Festival in collaboration with local artists, Norfolk & Norwich Open Studios is completely open access and one of the most successful schemes of its kind in the UK. The scheme gives the public a chance to meet artists in an informal setting, to see, buy and commission artwork and discuss the techniques and processes used to create the work. It allows artists from all over the region the chance to connect with their audience, and in many cases the public can watch as they work in their studio setting. This could be anywhere from a dedicated studio to a living room or a church, a boat, a barn, a shed, a gallery or a garden. It's a wonderful opportunity for the public to see artists at work and buy art at affordable prices. Some artists host demonstrations, workshops, talks and other additional events giving visitors the opportunity to try new techniques and learn about art for themselves. In 2012 430 artists, working in art forms ranging from painting, drawing and sculpture to textiles, jewellery, glass and wood, took part in the scheme. There were 13 Art Trails around the county in the 2012 scheme, over 80 separate events and 19 schools opened their doors to show the public a future generation of budding artists. Around 29,200 people visited studios across the region and spending an estimated £364,300 on works of art. Research by the scheme's organisers showed this year that an incredible 7 out of 10 visitors ate out in a local restaurant or café as part of their open studio visits, demonstrating how the scheme helps make a significant contribution to the local Norfolk economy. For Open Studios 2013 artists are again encouraged to group together to create the popular Art Trails. In previous years a growing number of participants have collaborated to create maps, guiding visitors around the studios of artists in a particular area of the county.

Open Studios 2013 will take place from **Saturday 25 May to Sunday 9 June 2013** and applications are now open until the **closing date of Friday 14 December**. Department for Education Launches Multi Million Funding Programme

Voluntary and community sector organisations, social enterprises and other notfor-profit organisations are invited to apply to the Department for Education's new National Prospectus Grants Programme 2013-15. The programme will provide up to £30 million in grant funding for each year in 2013-14 and 2014-15. Although there is no stated minimum or maximum level of funding, it is thought that most bids will be between £100,000 and £750,000 per year.

Proposals should be new and innovative and improve outcomes for children, young people and families with a particular emphasis on early intervention and supporting the most disadvantaged.

Projects must address one of the following priorities:

- Promote excellence in early education and childcare, so enabling all children to achieve success in their early years and later education.
- Develop and reform safeguarding services that protect and support children at risk of harm.
- Develop and reform the care system and speed up the process of adoption.
- Develop and reform services that support children with SEN, disabilities and other health needs.
- Focus and develop local services to support improved outcomes for young people, particularly the most disadvantaged and vulnerable.

Big Lottery Fund Announces £165m Fulfilling Lives: A Better Start Initiative (England)

The Big Lottery Fund (BIG) has announced that it is to invest £165 million in improving the life chances of over 10,000 of England's most vulnerable 0-3 year olds. BIG will invest between £30 and £50 million in three to five local authority areas over the next ten years and gather evidence to demonstrate the benefit of support in the early years for children, society and the economy. BIG will ask local authorities and their partners to plan and invest for the long-term. BIG aims to work with all new parents in a target area and then to focus more support on the 20-30 per cent most in need. Local Authorities will be able to express an interest in their area being long-listed to apply for a development grant. Development grants will be awarded to a shortlist of 10-15 areas. Final grants will be awarded to voluntary and community sector-led partnerships. The partnership will involve relevant local public agencies, including the local authority and local health agencies. Letters will go to Local Authority Chief Executives and Directors of Children's Services inviting them to express their interest in taking part in the Big Lottery Fund Early Years initiative. Arts Council England new grants programmes

Earlier this week Arts Council England announced three schemes which aim to continue to improve long term sustainability, diversity and resilience in the arts and culture:

Catalyst Arts: fundraising capacity: A £7 million fund open to applications from consortiums of organisations. Applications must be submitted by 5pm, Wednesday 23 January 2013. The aim of the Catalyst Arts: building fundraising capacity scheme is to enable arts organisations with an underdeveloped fundraising model to increase capacity and expertise in this area and improve their resilience. In the long-term, organisations will be better able to embed new business models that increase and diversify their income to deliver great art for everyone. These models should aim to attract fundraising from a variety of sources, particularly private giving.

This scheme is designed to help organisations with little or no experience of fundraising to:

- build capacity to address both shared and individual fundraising development needs of consortia members
- identify and develop effective fundraising models that have a long-term impact on the business model of each organisation

Transforming arts fundraising commissioned grant: Also part of the Catalyst programme, the Transforming arts fundraising commissioned grant is open to applications until 5pm, Wednesday 23 January 2013. The Wingate Foundation's Music Grants programme supports those areas of music performance and education which do not readily attract backing from commercial sponsors or other funding bodies, or which are not eligible for public funding. Priority will be given to those organisations which give opportunities to young professionals and to education projects for young people as well as for new adult audiences. This would include direct assistance as well as funding for organisations which promote their work or performance, and support for master classes. Funding to Enhance Community Facilities (England, Scotland & Wales)

Under the Sita Trust's Enhancing Communities Programme Core Fund, grants of up to £60,000 are available to not for profit organisations, community groups, parish councils, local authorities and charities for projects that make physical improvements to community facilities and historic buildings / structures. SITA will accept applications from projects which are within 3 miles of qualifying SITA UK waste processing sites.
