The scheme provides practical training in leading groups out of doors, including road crossings, near water safety and basic way finding.

- This Practical Part B course can be delivered locally in schools or clusters to reduce costs & travel & can be day time or after school. Subject to suitable local locations with walking routes & near water access.
- It is advised that this is course follows from Part A Theory.
- This course will raise confidence & competence that should support commitment in leading effective & safe visits.
