However, when we arrived at the beautiful riverside Musikacademie and had our first rehearsal, I could tell it would be a fun and rewarding week.

The next day was quite intensive and delivered an incredible amount of progress, as well as giving the viola section our first encounter with Fabian, soon to become a legend. After working hard (until my fingertips were black from the fingerboard), it was great to explore the surrounding area and experience 'Spaghetti-Eis' for the first time. Wednesday saw us all escaping from the Musikacademie to see some of the sights in the local area. After completing the tough challenge of running to the top of the Ehrenbreitstein Fortress viewing point, taking a photo and making it back onto the coach within 15 minutes, we headed on to the Marksburg Castle. Of particular interest was the historical torture chamber, which provided an insight into how people were made to suffer before the invention of the sectional rehearsal. In the evenings it was fun to meet new friends down in the cellar or take a stroll by the stunning Rhein. Hearing solo violinist Jacob Meining's playing was truly inspirational and it was great to be a part of the music we played with him, including one piece that had never before been performed in Germany. Another highlight was Friday evening's talent show, where we enjoyed many quality performances, followed by Andy playing the nose-flute in a tear-jerking rendition of London Derrière. Saturday, and concert day was here at last. All our hard work paid off as we gave our performance, enjoying being united in music and realising just how quickly the week had flown by. Then it was back to the academie one last time to celebrate with a well-earned party. We returned to England (just before my postcards got there) tired but cheerful, with many happy memories, music stuck in our heads and Facebook friend requests to be exchanged with our fellow musicians. Thank you so much to everyone who helped to make this fantastic opportunity a reality.
