
Why not use World Book Day to encourage any children who are not yet public library members to sign up - there's a form in the pack.

We are often asked about the best way of using ebooks and ereaders in schools.


Amazon have now said that Kindle books are only for personal use and cannot be loaned out to students. Lending them will mean you have broken the terms of the licence. This means Kindles are not suitable for use in schools. So where next?

Norfolk SLS are working with Peters Booksellers and Wheelers Books to bring a new 'ebook platform' to you. We will soon be ready to launch a pilot with a few schools to begin with. The platform will enable you to borrow ebooks at very reasonable cost through the School Library Service. In terms of devices now that Kindles are off the scene, we have been playing with Kobos and Sony ereaders, but you will be able to download these ebooks onto any computer or device. Let us know if you are interested in being involved in the pilot. You will need to have a group of students with their own devices or devices which can be loaned by the school.

Walter Tull's story inspired Michael Morpurgo's novel 'A Medal For Leroy'. His unusual and courageous life (first black professional footballer, first black officer in the British army, but killed in 1918) is



attractively portrayed in this KS2 level biography.

Duffy, Carol Ann (ed); illus Emily Gravett. 101 Poems for Children An anthology of classic, women and modern poets all contribute to a collection of poems varying in mood from the lyrical to the nonsense.

Dave Shelton's move from comics with this Costa shortlisted title, a beautifully produced and illustrated novel has, frankly, got us nonplussed. Just what is it about? Does it matter? Try it for yourselves – and more importantly, with your pupils...
