Story telling and story making in the outdoors



Environmental and Outdoor Learning

Audience: Forest School Practitioners, Teachers, LSAs, Governors, EYF teachers – for all Schools

Context: A one day training course designed to build confidence and practice in oral story telling. How to use the natural world to spark children's creativity and use this to develop their story building and literacy skills.

The course will provide candidates with an introduction to story telling techniques and how to use stories in the outdoors to support creativity in learners. We will be focusing on stories inspired by nature and the environment, which may be very appropriate for use within Forest School and other Outdoor Learning programmes, as well as within general literacy lessons.

The course is led by Jon Cree, an internationally renowned trainer within the outdoor and environmental education sector.

Objectives:

The course will help delegates:

- Increase confidence, understanding and skills in story telling
- Develop an understanding of how stories can be used to support learning in the outdoors
- Begin to develop a repitoir of stories to use with learners
- Develop opprtunities for story-making with learners using natural materials
