



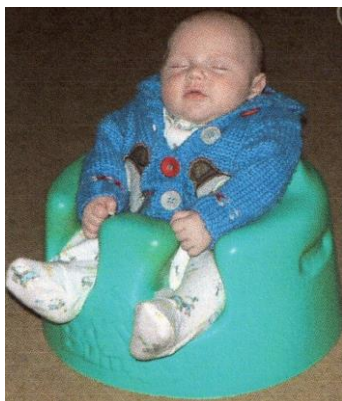
Right from

FREE workshop



The aims of the training are to give an overview of Right From The Start by exploring the principles ethos and materials whilst identifying, developing and sharing effective practices. The workshop facilitates a style of learning that encourages critical reflective practice and continuous professional development.

This workshop will be of benefit to professionals and practitioners who share the news as well as those who work with parents before, during and after the news has been shared.

Research shows that how parents are listened to, and how the news is shared with them, can have a profound effect on the outcomes for the child and family. It can also impact on how parents interact with the professionals that they will meet on their journey of having a child with additional needs. The recent Norfolk Diagnosis Survey Report and the recommendations within that report have been used to support the training and make it locally relevant.
