Author visits this term

By the time you read this our first batch of visits to schools by non-fiction Author Steve Parker will already have happened. We know how powerful meeting a 'real live author' can be for some children and Steve is

still happy to book more visits in the New Year. He is best for your KS2 children. His subjects are science and nature based - his book "Science Crazy" recently won a School Library Association Information Book Award and he also talks about the nature of team working in publishing.

We are very close to announcing our new '**Author in residence**' who will be available next term and in the Summer term for visits in KS1 and 2.

Improve your children's maths – get them reading!

A recent Institute of Education study found that children who read for pleasure made more progress in maths, vocabulary and spelling between the ages of 10 and 16 than those who rarely read.

Children who were read to regularly by their parents at age 5 performed better in all three tests at age 16 than those who were not helped in this way, although by the age of 10 children reading for pleasure was more vital to their progress than their parents' education levels.

Reading for pleasure had the strongest effect on children's vocabulary development, but the impact on spelling and maths was still significant
