#### HOPLESSLY DEVOTED SYNOPSIS

'Chess ain't nothing like life.' 'Course it is.' 'Where's the jail, then?' 'The whole thing's the jail. The whole board.' 'How'd you get out?' 'You finish the game.'

Chess is in prison, but has found happiness with her cellmate-turned-soulmate Serena. After signing up for a 12-week music rehabilitation course, she meets music producer Silver, who's there to battle her own demons.

As Chess continues to work with Silver, they develop a mutual understanding. Chess channels her pain and longing for daughter, which comes out in a deep and soulful voice. To her surprise, Silver finds a powerful voice in Chess, and begins to have bigger dreams for her.

Soon after, Chess finds out that Serena will be released on parole. On her release, Serena promises Chess that she'll find her now 13-year old daughter Kayla, and give her a CD of the songs Chess is making with Silver.



When Serena is released, Chess feels lonely – truly isolated from the world for the first time, claustrophobic in the cell she now shares alone. Serena finds it hard adjusting to life on the outside and reconnecting with her kids.

Chess gives Serena her completed CD of songs when she comes to visit her. Serena promises again that she'll find her daughter, but Chess won't hear any of it; won't allow herself to hope. She gets back to her cell – where she tries to kill herself.

Silver visits Chess after she's put in segregation, where she reveals she sees the ghost of the abusive husband she murdered everywhere she goes. But she's now ready to face the ghosts of her past and fight back.

Serena uploads one of Chess' songs online, in the hope to reach out to Kayla. It ends up an instant hit on the radio, but misconceived to be Silver's song by the public. Chess agrees to finally do a gig that will be live-streamed from the prison, to correct the mistake made – so Kayla knows her mother is reaching out to her. She lets out an explosive song, bearing it all. 'Be stronger, don't fall down underneath it no longer.'



#### KATE TEMPEST ON HOPELESSLY DEVOTED

I am still relatively new to theatre and feel like I am discovering more about what it can be and do every time I see or read a play or spend time in a space where a play is being shown.

I believe that theatres can be spaces where people - staff, cast, crew and audience - feel comfortable, excited and inspired. Where you don't feel silly or intimidated but welcomed and where your ideas, as audience members, are acknowledged as being the most important ideas in the room - If a play can live one day outside the theatre, it's only because someone in the audience has taken it home and thought about it.

Hopelessly Devoted is essentially a play about love and creativity, and what these things can mean for people, even in the most restricted environments. I was deeply moved by the experience of visiting HMP Holloway earlier this year, when a forum theatre play I wrote for homeless theatre company Cardboard Citizens was touring. Although



Hopelessly Devoted doesn't tell anyone's individual story, I would like to thank the inmates and staff at HMP Holloway, and Cardboard Citizens, for allowing me an insight into what we can too easily forget is happening to our mothers, sisters, friends and lovers. I began to wonder whether the transcendental powers of love and creativity would be strengthened or destroyed by a prison cell.

I wanted to play with music. I feel like when you're watching a singer, you know that it's live and it feels like it's happening only for you. I wanted to bring some of those feelings into the theatre. I hope that when Chess sings it feels like a gig, in the sense that you feel like someone is showing you their heart, not just their best heart impression. I've never written songs for others to sing, or even thought about how a musical might unfold, this has added to the excitement and terror of trying new things in new places.

No matter what my hopes for the play are though, it means nothing until its seen and felt by an audience. This is the thing about theatre that I love the most - It's truly about the experience of the thing when it's on its feet and happening in the room. It's been amazing to work with such a talented team and watching the actors and director at work has been like a masterclass in how to be excellent at doing what you love.

We offer workshops to accompany Paines Plough productions to give students a deeper insight into the work and our creative process. As a new writing company, our workshops focus on writing, directing, acting or setting up a company, and draw on the process we use in working with writers to move from a first draft to a full production.

HOPELESSLY DEVOTED workshops will give students a practical insight into the creative process, drawing on themes in the play, and will provide students with skills to embark on their own projects as writers, directors and actors. Workshops will enhance students abilities in the areas of performance, directing and critical analysis.

Our workshops take place either with actors from the production or one of our Artistic or Associate Directors. They are suitable for students at GCSE, BTEC, A level and Degree level. A typical workshop will include:

- An insight into the journey of HOPELESSLY DEVOTED from page-to-stage.
- Insights into writing, directing, acting and producing.
- Practical acting and directing exercises working with the HOPELESSLY DEVOTED script.

Each workshop will be bespoke, responding to the particular interests and needs of participants.
