Phonics

If delegates are new to phonics, it is recommended that that they attend the "What is synthetic phonics?" course first.



What is synthetic phonics? (Course Code. EPGF8) 01/04/14, from 09:00 to 12:00 at NPDC

An introduction to the principles of systematic synthetic phonics which will equip delegates with the core body of relevant subject knowledge.

Delegates will be given the confidence that they know 'what phonics is all about'. It will encourage delegates working with children to use phonics correctly as part of their daily practice.

This course works well as either a stand alone or as an introduction before attending the KS1 and KS2 Phonics courses.

How and what do I teach In Reception and KS1? (Course Code. EPGG2) 13/05/14, from 09:00 to 12:00 at NPDC

An introduction to the principles of planning for effective phonics considering progression, assessment and practical teaching activities.

Delegates will be introduced to the structure of *Letters and Sounds* and each phase of phonics. The planning of phonic sessions will be modelled and new phonic games introduced and played. Different ways of assessing phonics will be considered.

How and what do I teach in KS2? (Course Code. EPGG3) 14/05/14, from 09:00 to 12:00 at NPDC

Using and adapting the programme *Letters and Sounds*, this course will introduce delegates to the principles of planning for effective synthetic phonics teaching in KS2.

Packed with practical teaching activities, this course will also provide delegates with a clear overview of progression and support with assessment.

Although these courses will use the Letters and Sounds programme, the principles and practice covered are fully supportive of other schemes.
