To commemorate the centenary of the First World War, Norwich Theatre Royal, with support from Norfolk County Council and generous funding from the Heritage Lottery Fund, has developed 'To End All Wars', a major new learning and performance programme aimed at schools and young people across Norfolk.

The new website-based learning programme reveals the stories of six fascinating people who originated from, lived in or worked in the county during the period and is aimed at all schools across Norfolk through Key Stages 1-4. Materials include fact files, historical documents, questions/activities and a toolkit for schools to begin their own WW1 studies.

The morning launch event will introduce teachers to the website-based learning programme and how it can be used to support planning under the new curriculum, meet the project team including staff from NIAS and to find out about support available.
