The Carnegie Trust UK has launched a new competition to help regenerate the UK's Town Centres. Call for physical performers and dancers for new outdoor dance work – Laura McGill Dance

Laura McGill Dance are looking for dancers and physical performers to undertake a period of research and development to create a new outdoor dance-theatre piece involving performers between the ages of 20 to 50 plus, with 2 confirmed public performances at this stage on the 10th May at the Norfolk and Norwich Festival and early September at the Out There Festival, Great Yarmouth.

They are looking for up to 6 physical performers for this project:

- 1 male and 1 female performer in their 20's

This dual site contemporary art project will take place over 23 days in August/September 2014 in the beautiful grounds of the recently-opened River Waveney Study Centre in Earsham, known to many as the site of the former Otter Trust, and the cosy Ravenous Cafe, Raveningham. The exhibitions are being organised by Waveney & Blyth Arts in collaboration with the River Waveney Trust who manage the Study Centre site. The main purposes of the exhibitions are: to encourage public interaction with contemporary art, give artists a platform for selling their work and boost cultural tourism in the River Waveney area. Both will be curated by Sarah Cannell and artists are invited to submit ideas and proposals.

River Art Trail

Our plan is to include existing work and new site-specific sculptures and installations by East Anglian artists to form a trail around the River Waveney Trust site, and an exhibition of wildlife photography in the visitor centre. The curator is particularly looking for contemporary artists who create sculpture, installation, site specific or photographic works which will respond to the rural setting. The site follows part of the river Waveney as it snakes through the water meadows of the Waveney Valley, and there is also a small island accessible via a footbridge which would lend itself to thoughtful artistic responses. A site visit will be arranged in May for selected artists.

Following on from the successful Claws, Beaks and Feathers exhibition organised by Waveney & Blyth Arts and Ravenous in 2013 we would also like applications from artists creating 2D works or small 3D works inspired by the rural countryside of Norfolk and Suffolk.

Funding is available under the Wellcome Trust's Peoples and Society Awards for projects that encourage public debate and understanding of biomedical science. Projects can include:

- Workshops and seminars
- Arts projects for various different audiences and age groups
- Teaching materials or techniques to encourage wider discussions
- Projects that use the collections of the Wellcome Library and the Wellcome Collection at the Science Museum.

The People Awards (up to and including £30,000) are for innovative and creative projects in the UK and/or the Republic of Ireland that engage the public with biomedical science and/or the history of medicine. They can fund small-to-medium-sized one-off projects or projects that pilot new ideas with an aim to scale up or become sustainable following the grant, or they can part-fund larger projects. Society Awards (above £30,000) can fund the scaling-up of successfully piloted projects (whether funded through People Awards or through other means) or can fund projects that are more ambitious in scale and impact than is possible through a People Award. Society Award projects would normally expect to reach audiences with a wide geographical spread across the UK and/or Republic of Ireland. They can also part-fund larger projects. Funding can be for up to three years.

Applications can be made by a wide variety of individuals, organisations and partnerships.
