Inspired by WW1 commemorations, the programme includes Geoffrey Burgon's spiritually infused choral music and culminates in the new work 'Eventide' (In Memoriam Edith Cavell) by composer Patrick Hawes, with the transcendent voices of both Sheringham & Cromer Choral Society and Gresham's Prep School Chapel Choir.

There are also lots of free events for children and families, an internationally acclaimed Art Prize and outdoor events that bring a blaze of colour and activity to the streets of the town.

Sheringham and Cromer Choral Society

Founded in 1933, the choir currently has a membership of around 100 and has a varied repertoire made up of mainly large choral works by composers from the 17th through to the 21st century. Each year the choir puts on three concerts and also runs a 'Come and Sing' event in the early autumn. The choir welcomes singers of all voices and abilities without audition.
