

Half Term Opportunity for Students:

DESiGN Residential Programme at Holt Hall

Norfolk students are invited to attend DESiGN, Developing Environmental Sustainability in Greater Norfolk.

"DESiGN" is a residential education programme run by Marshall Scholars at Holt Hall in Norfolk. Friday 30 May - Sunday 1 June 2014, Norfolk students can join several American postgraduate and University of East Anglia undergraduate mentors to explore environmental arts, policy, and science for three days in the beautiful grounds of Holt Hall enhancing their leadership, communication, and campaigning skills. DESiGN is intended to provide a fun but enriching opportunity for individuals and friends during Half Term, building skills and confidence to better prepare students for GCSEs, A levels, and university study.

DESiGN is an open programme targeted at Years 8-10. Slightly older or younger students will be considered, but students are expected to be able to conduct themselves appropriately and independently in a diverse residential setting. At least four responsible and experienced adults will be staying overnight, in addition to a team of university mentors.

Individual students and groups are invited to register now. Participation is limited to 30 students on a first-come, first-served basis. Parental permission is required. The programme is subsidised and run by the Marshall Scholars in partnership with Norfolk County Council and Friends of Holt Hall. Thanks to our partners' support, cost to students is just £50 each for the three days including all meals and lodging. Families are responsible for transport to and from Holt Hall.
