Domestic abuse information Leaflets in multi-languages

Norfolk Constabulary is committed to taking positive action against domestic abuse and sexual violence by supporting vulnerable victims, carrying out and reviewing risk assessments, conducting vigorous investigations and where possible, successfully prosecuting domestic and sexual abuse perpetrators.

The Vulnerability and Partnerships Command have already created Domestic Abuse awareness posters and a Domestic Abuse advice leaflet for adult members of the public (including victims of abuse) which contains the following guidance;

- What is domestic abuse? containing the new definition
- How can the police help?
- Planning to leave? comprehensive safety planning advice
- **Help is available?** How to contact the police and Harbour Centre
- Additional support National and local agencies who can assist victims

The Sexual Assault Referral Centre (SARC, Harbour Centre) have also published their information and all the leaflets and posters are now available in the following languages.

In addition to the above we have created posters specifically for children and our aim is to ensure young people from communities across Norfolk are aware of the rights and wrongs of relationships, while knowing where to go for help and advice when things in a relationship make them worried or upset, whether that is at home or school.
