

‘Walking the Boudica Way’ is a walk along the route taken by Boudica’s army in her efforts to oust the Romans. It is also a commitment to improving schools in Norfolk drawing on the resources of its people, history and environment. It will be an experience, a series of events, a sharing of resources, a film, a blog and an exhibition. ‘Walking the Boudica Way’ involves taking an attitude: that we can improve things in important sustainable ways when we take control of our own development and link it to deeply held shared values.

Pictures, stories, films and art from the Walk will be displayed at an exhibition in October.

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The Walk is linked to work with the 'Index for Inclusion: developing learning and participation in schools', used in more than forty countries and across Norfolk.
