What Next?

The Festival, along with the Writers' Centre are convening a What Next? chapter in Norwich. What Next? is a national movement to advocate for the value of arts and culture to our lives. Currently, a flexible group is meeting weekly at either the Writers' Centre or NORCA HQ in Colegate.

There is now a cycle of meetings - week one is about issues that affect artists and practitioners - anyone can attend but that is the topic, the following week is a project meeting - currently we are talking about how we can jointly evaluate the impact of culture to make more robust evidence available, the third week is a speaker and the fourth a joined up Norfolk & Suffolk meeting alternately in Norwich or Ipswich. It is an open group and doesn't belong to anybody specific though the Festival do the basic organisation so please come and find out more.

What Next? is an opportunity to talk about issues that affect us and our sector, and help to build the case for funding and support for arts-based activities. It will also be the springboard for sector-

Lights out

At 11pm on 4 August 1914 Britain declared war on Germany, ushering in one of the darkest periods in our history.

As the moment approached, the British Foreign Secretary Sir Edward Grey made the famous remark: "The lamps are going out all over Europe; we shall not see them lit again in our life-time". In a dramatic UK-wide event LIGHTS OUT is an invitation to everyone to turn off their lights from 10pm to 11pm on 4th August, leaving on a single light or candle for this shared moment of reflection. Part of 14-18 NOW, WW1 Centenary Art Commissions, LIGHTS OUT has invited artists to create large-scale, site-specific artworks at locations across the UK. A digital artwork will also be commissioned in response to LIGHTS OUT.

LIGHTS OUT, working closely with the Royal British Legion, will be one of the largest participatory events of its kind ever seen in the UK, and will complement the candlelit vigil held at Westminster Abbey on 4th August.

Near Neighbours Grants (England)

The Department for Communities & Local Government has announced that it is planning to re-open its Near Neighbours small grants programme in June 2014. Launched in 2011 in partnership with the Church Urban Fund, Near Neighbours provides small grants of up to £5,000 to grassroots groups and multi-faith communities. Funding will be available to communities with significant religious diversity to help them run projects which will bring about lasting benefits to their neighbourhoods. Charities, religious organisations, Community Interest Companies, social enterprises and groups of individuals focusing on community benefit will be eligible to apply. Preference is given to applications from small faith or community organisations with a turnover of less than £150,000. Some successful Near Neighbours projects to have benefited from the small grants include:

- a youth football team in East London - using sport to provide mentoring and development opportunities;
- a youth music programme in Oldham which has brought people together from different backgrounds; and
- a community garden in Leicester created by local residents and school children and enjoyed by the whole community.

Holiday Grants for Children (UK)

The Henry Smith's Charity has announced that the next deadline for its Holiday Grant for Children Programme is the 1st October 2014. Wolfson Foundation Secondary Education Programme (UK)

The Wolfson Foundation has announced that its Secondary Education Programme is open for applications. Through its Secondary Education Programme high-achieving state-funded and

independent schools and sixth form colleges can apply to the Foundation for funding for capital or equipment projects relating to the teaching of science and technology, languages, music, the arts or libraries. Grants do not normally exceed £50,000 for state schools, £40,000 for independent schools or £100,000 for sixth form colleges. Projects should focus on students taking A-Level or GCSE examinations. Examples of schools that have received funding through the Foundation include:

- Greenhead College, a Sixth Form College in Huddersfield, which received a grant of £100,000 which enabled them to refurbish three chemistry laboratories and two technicians rooms.
- Upton Hall School on Merseyside which was awarded £32,000 towards science equipment. The project was partly based on the enthusiasm generated by pupils taking part in the 2008 Shanghai Youth Science and Technology Expo, with the school aiming to build on the scientific skills and confidence gained during this trip.

There is a two stage application process and the next deadline for submitting stage 1 applications is the 30th November 2014. If eligible, applicants will be invited to submit a stage 2 application.

Wellcome Trust Peoples & Society Awards (UK)

Funding is available under the Wellcome Trust's Peoples and Society Awards for projects that encourage public debate and understanding of biomedical science. Projects can include:

- Workshops and seminars
- Arts projects for various different audiences and age groups
- Teaching materials or techniques to encourage wider discussions; etc.

The People Awards (up to and including £30,000) are for innovative and creative projects in the UK and/or the Republic of Ireland that engage the public with biomedical science and/or the history of medicine. They can fund small-to-medium-sized one-off projects or projects that pilot new ideas with an aim to scale up or become sustainable following the grant, or they can part-fund larger projects.

Society Awards (above £30,000) can fund the scaling-up of successfully piloted projects (whether funded through People Awards or through other means) or can fund projects that are more ambitious in scale and impact than is possible through a People Award. Society Award projects would normally expect to reach audiences with a wide geographical spread across the UK and/or Republic of Ireland. They can also part-fund larger projects. Funding can be for up to three years. Applications can be made by a wide variety of individuals, organisations and partnerships.
