Michelle Savage is the North Norfolk BLAH LGBT Youth Development Worker, she is also a freelance community filmmaker called Shelly Telly. She has been commissioned by the Norfolk LGBT Project to create a multimedia exhibition for the Fusion screen in the Forum on the day of Norwich Pride - Saturday 26th July. It is called Proud Schools and the idea is to showcase the work that Norfolk schools are doing to celebrate diversity and challenge homophobia and transphobia in the classroom and the playground.

If you don't know Fusion, it's a giant screen that has 3 programmable projectors. Her vision is that as you walk into the room, it will feel like you are stepping into a classroom - the screen will look like a wall filled with posters and artwork and an interactive whiteboard.
