






Conversion of Contacts to Referrals by Source:






Commentary:

The seasonal drop in both contacts and referrals is substantially accounted for by school holidays (547 school contacts in July to 9 in August) and contacts from individuals. Contact to Referral has dropped to 17%. The re referral rate is sitting below the England average but above Statistical Neighbours*.

Both the numbers and timeliness of completed Initial Assessments have dropped and needs to turn around. August data is traditionally impacted by annual leave. If we accept this there is an expectation of improvement next month

Further work is taking place to understand the reasons for the increase in S17 without an up to date plan which is only partly explained by an overall increase in the numbers of S17 cases.


The number and proportion of CWD without an up to date plan has risen and further analysis will be undertaken to understand why this has happened.





Jul-14 Jun-14 Aug-14 Social Worker visits to Children on a Child Protection Plan in Timescales:





Rate of Children on a CP Plan per 10,000 Under-18 Population:



Commentary:


Child Protection visits by social workers: we have moved from 30 to 20 working-day visiting schedule. Performance is sticking at around 80% and we need to drive this upwards. The number seen alone is stubbornly low and we need to promote the value of direct work with children and their families.

Children subject of Child Protection Plans: We continue to have lower numbers of children subject to CP Plans compared with the England and Statistical Neighbour averages, however this is likely to rise as the number of LAC and the use of accommodation diminishes.




Number of Looked-After Children:

The percentage of Looked-After Children not allocated to a qualified social worker needs scrutiny as it seems to have dropped.

Health of LAC: Development Checks continue to improve and are well ahead of comparators. Immunisations have flat lined as have Health assessment and are below comparators. Although performance around Dental checks has improved it remains below the England average.

Care planning: the data shows improvement but qualitative audit has exposed by contrast some very poor practice.

Rate of LAC: the population rise of the last few years seems to have steadied and is gradually falling. We need to focus attention with renewed vigour and drive down numbers towards comparators at greater pace
