



Diabetes training for schools

There is one session planned for the autumn term which will take place on:

Who is this training for?

Headteachers, Senior Leaders, Pastoral Workers, Teaching Assistants and other staff with a responsibility for managing pupils with medical conditions. This will be the final training session for 2014 and although the training will take place in Great Yarmouth it is open to any school in Norfolk and Waveney and colleagues from the Paediatric Diabetes teams from each of the hospitals hope to attend.

By attending this training participants will have:

- Up to date information about Diabetes and how best children can manage the condition in school
- An understanding of how Diabetes is treated and managed and the implications for individual school management and policy
- An opportunity to explore issues of inclusion and equality
- An opportunity to share good practice and problem-solve with colleagues from schools and Diabetic Nurse Specialists

This training course is delivered at no cost to schools through a partnership between Paediatric Diabetes Outreach Nurses from the 3 Norfolk Hospitals.

By attending the training participants will gain an understanding of this medical condition and its impact on children and young people in school. Participants will be provided with supporting information to cascade to colleagues back in school. Many schools will already have pupils with a diagnosis of diabetes and all schools may find pupils with diabetes will come to their school at some point.
