"And don't worry if you only have one half of the intergenerational partnership - we will help match you with another half from organisations in your local area."

Sharon Harkin, from the East of England Co-Op, says,

"As well as looking for new and innovative ideas, in considering who to select as winners, the panel will be picking out projects that have the potential to be shared with others and rolled out across the county. We are interested in projects that involve people from hard to reach parts of the community; and those that have involved more than just a one-off event.

"The East of England Co-Op are particularly keen to see projects that involve people living with dementia and we are delighted that there is a special prize for this category."
