Teaching and Learning

New curriculum: teaching evolution



A course to equip teachers with the subject knowledge, resources and strategies to teach evolution effectively.

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Beginning with the requirements in the Year 2 programme of study: *identify that most living things live in habitats to which they are suited,* this course will examine, in practical activities, those elements of the biology programme of study that contribute to an understanding of evolution.

The greater part of the day will be spent exploring resources and strategies for teaching evolution. This will include both subject knowledge, including the work of Charles Darwin and Alfred Wallace, and practical teaching activities.

By the end of the day, delegates will:

- have sufficient subject knowledge to be confident in teaching evolution
- be familiar with resources and strategies for teaching evolution
- know how the earlier elements of the biology strand of the national curriculum supports the teaching of evolution.
- create a sequence of lesson plans for teaching evolution in upper KS2.
