Visit the 'Homage to Manet' Exhibition at Norwich Castle

Homage to Manet focuses on the French painter Edouard Manet (1832–1883) and the important legacy of his art in Britain. It also looks at the connections between Manet and French Impressionism, and with other later artists who were influenced by his example, bring your students to take a look!

Consider the changes in the style and subject matter of painting and the huge effect of photography on art from Manet's time to the modern day.

Using the Manet exhibition and our permanent collection as inspiration, these workshops focus on individual and group portraiture in contemporary art.

Drawing Portraits KS2

2 hours £2.50 per pupil

Create and act out group portraits and scenarios. Experiment and explore portraiture through quick fire, expressive life drawing using observation skills and learn to construct interesting and confident compositions.

Portraits: The person behind the Picture KS 3–5

3 hour session

Cost £5.00 per student or a minimum fee of £100.00 for fewer than 20 students

What do pose, costume, backgrounds and objects tell us about a person's identity?

Use portraits in the museum collections to decode and record information.

Students consider how visual messages can affect the way people view us and produce a mixed media self portrait referencing social media.
