Litcham School wins the Kids' Lit Quiz National final!

City Academy once again hosted an exciting Kids' Lit Quiz on Thursday 20th November 2014. Twenty nine teams from across Norfolk (and a couple from Suffolk and Lincolnshire) battled it out over 10 rounds of tough questions. It was great to have two authors with us; Alexander Gordon Smith was in the Librarian team (who technically won by half a point, but for part of the event had an extra member!) and Kevin Crossley-Holland who assisted with the scoring and presented the cup. Once again, we were overwhelmed by just how much the students competing knew about a wide range



of literature. There was a great atmosphere and as always, it was such a pleasure to talk to so many young people who had a clear passion and enthusiasm for reading

The quiz came to an exciting conclusion with a third place-deciding sudden death question between two schools, Thorpe St Andrew's Team B and Old Buckenham High. In the end Old Buckenham High successfully took 3rd place, last year's winners Thetford Grammar were placed 2nd and coming first were Litcham School, who then went on to **win the National Final** which took place in London on 4th December!
