## Grant funding: Foyle Foundation Schools Library Programme (UK)

State funded schools that want to improve their libraries can apply for funding through the Foyle Foundation Schools Library Programme. This programme recognises that many school libraries are in a desperate situation through underfunding and underdevelopment, and are not equipped to encourage children to read widely and read more.

The average grant is between £3,000 and £10,000. Please note that there are questions about working with the local School Library Service, and details of any audits are required. The School Library Service has an excellent audit service; just get in touch with the team to find out more. Recent projects supported by Norfolk SLS that have received Foyle Foundation funding include: All Saints Primary, Stibbard and St Martha's Primary. Applications can be submitted at any time. #### Norfolk's Great Big Read – class visits to the public library

Norfolk public libraries and mobile libraries are encouraging all the adults in Norfolk to pick up and enjoy a book with Norfolk's Great Big Read from March  $23^{rd} - 25^{th}$  April.

Adults in care-giving roles – particularly parents and carers but also school staff - are the most important role models for children in encouraging them to see that reading is enjoyable. Supporting children to read for pleasure, as a leisure activity, is one of the most important things we can do for children's literacy and life chances.

So during February and March, if you arrange a school visit to your local library the children will receive an invitation for them to give to their parents and carers to encourage the grown ups to go to the library and pick up a book! Your school will also be entered into a prize draw to win 2 SLS tokens! Please just email the SLS team to let us know your school has visited the library.

Libraries may have limited capacity for school visits so please book well in advance to avoid disappointment and allow time for library joining forms to be sent home so children make the most of their library visit.
