By car

UEA is situated two miles west of Norwich city centre, just off Earlham Road (B1108).

From London, take the M11/A11 north. Just before Norwich, take the A47 towards Swaffham – UEA is signposted at the next exit B1108. From the North or Midlands, you can travel via either the A47 or A14 to Newmarket and join the A11.

By train

Trains from London Liverpool St run every 30 minutes during peak times and take just under 2 hours. There is an Intercity link with the Midlands and the North via Peterborough. From Norwich railway station, the 25 and 26 buses run regularly to the campus.

By bus or coach

National Express coaches run to Surrey Street Bus Station in Norwich city centre. Some of these go the campus. Alternatively you can take a 25 or 26 bus from St Stephen's Street (just round the corner) to the campus.
