Enterprise Education in the Green and Social Economy



Developing education for responsible entrepreneurship across the curriculum, campus, community and culture of your school.

We will consider how to integrate education for responsible entrepreneurship within the formal and informal curriculum. We will explore a pedagogical framework for education for responsible entrepreneurship including student competencies and related accreditation.

We will look at UK/European case studies of social and sustainable enterprises and cooperatives as well as exploring class activities and games that introduce cooperatives, fair trade, ethical finance and global trade. Together we will examine opportunities for student links with other European countries and end by signposting delegates to networks, organisations and free resources that can support students and teachers in the area of responsible entrepreneurship.

By the end of the course we hope participants will go away having learned about:

- some alternative approaches to enterprise education for 14 19 year olds.
- the employability value to students of responsible entrepreneurship with a focus on the green and social economy
- how teachers can support student-led mini-enterprises
- a range of related class activities
- opportunities for student links with other European countries.
- opportunities for further support and networks for teachers.
