 Inspectors are looking for SLT member has responsibility, LAC make rapid progress from their starting points, excellent planning for transition and move to post 16 provision
- 2. How effectively is the achievement of LAC monitored?

 Progress monitored frequently with class teachers/ form tutors. LAC leader provides Virtual School Headteacher with achievement data frequently (you should be doing this through Welfare Call)
- 3. Do pupils receive high quality guidance?

 Teachers and TAs know who the LAC children are, ensure that feedback is high quality, have identified a member of staff as a key worker (secondary). Careers guidance staff know who LAC children are, and LAC are provided with frequent high quality guidance
- 4. Is the pupil premium grant spent effectively (in terms of LAC only)?

 LAC leader and Head of Virtual School liaise regularly to ensure Pupil Premium Grant is well-targeted to meet specific academic needs of LAC so they can make outstanding progress and gaps are narrowed. Governing Body is fully aware of the rationale for PPG spending and monitors closely. Virtual School holds school to account for the way the grant is spent (you will be asked to evaluate this term to Norfolk Virtual School. FSM and LAC attainment is reported separately to the Governing Body)
- 5. What is the quality of PEPs like? Do they show high expectations for academic progress? PEPS are comprehensive, an enduring record of LACs experience, progress and achievement. PEPS clearly linked to statements and IEPs if appropriate. Long and short term, SMART, aspirational targets are included. Regularly updated when targets are met, Pupil voice is evident.
- 6. Could this school provide a case study on good practice in terms of LAC achievement?

3. I provide the VSH with data on LAC attendance and achievement frequently.			
This is true for every Norfolk school with LAC as we collect attendance data from you weekly and achievement data termly through Welfare Call.			
4. I meet with the class teacher / form tutor of LAC pupils frequently to check progress.			
5. I have responsibility for spending the pupil premium grant for LAC.			
6. I am held to account for spending the pupil premium grant for LAC.			
Remember this must be reported on to Governors, must be published on your website and you will be asked by the Norfolk Virtual School for an evaluation of impact at the end of the summer term 2015 – as signalled in the LA Pupil Premium Plus policy.			
7. I provide governors with detailed information about how the pupil premium grant for LAC is spent and the difference it makes.			
Remember it is statutory responsibility for the school to provide an annual report for governors- usually from the Designated Teacher for LAC. It is also a statutory role within a governing body to have a Designated Governor for LAC.			
8. The virtual school provides support for LAC pupils in school.			
The 5 x Specialist Support Assistant's and 1 x KS4 tutor (named above in question 2 of this table) provide some targeted support for some Norfolk children.			
The support provided for LAC pupils by the Virtual School is effective in raising attainment.			
10. All PEPs for LAC in this school include challenging achievement targets
