

In 2014/15, 4 Norfolk schools took part in a pilot Sports Journalism programme targeted at **improving literacy** of pupils in Key Stage 3. Evaluation showed that pupils were highly engaged in taking on the role of 'trainee reporters' and made significant progress with communication skills.

Now we are **offering schools the chance** to learn how to teach **journalism** and be trained to use an **innovative online platform** to **raise levels in writing and speaking & listening** of all pupils, but especially reluctant learners.
