### Norfolk SLS eBook lending platform is now live!


Using our lending platform means that students have access to hundreds of books that can be read on their PC, tablet or phone whether they are at school, on the bus or relaxing at home.

A full day visit from Steve costs 5 tokens, a half day is 3 tokens.




Author of the successful 'Fury' series for Teens, Gordon offers both large group author talks and small writing workshops.


#### **Book reviews**



### When Mr Dog Bites by Brian Conaghan (£5.99, ISBN 9781408838365)

This is a powerful read, in turns poignant, sad and funny. Shocking too, as it is told through the voice of a Tourette's sufferer, a teenage boy who attends a special school, and we follow his trials of growing up in a world of secretive messed-up adults, and fellow teens who are also trying to make sense of who they are – some cruel, some suffering like our hero. By the end he is more confident and wise, but for me a flaw is that some of the other characters are less well drawn. The language of the book is of course sometimes very extreme, and this is not a book to give younger teens; but it can also

be very beautiful, and Dylan's obvious love of language is contrasted with the violent outbursts caused by his Tourette's in a startling and interesting way.



### Lies We tell Ourselves by Robyn Talley (£6.99, ISBN 978184845292)

This very impressive debut novel is set to shock almost as much as Malorie Blackman's Noughts and Crosses.

Set in 1959 America when 'white' schools are being forced to integrate black students, it vividly paints the struggle on both sides, faced by teachers, parents and not least students. Sarah and Linda hate each other – with good reason, but they find themselves drawn together in unexpected ways when they have to work on a school project. They both have to look deep into themselves and face up to

the unthinkable about their sexuality and race. Racism and strong language is in context.
