Textile Artist in Residence for Time & Tide Museum, Great Yarmouth Deadline: 14th Sept at 17.00

We are looking for a highly skilled textile artist to become the second of six crafts people in residence at Time and Tide Museum as part of our Crafting History programme. Crafting History is a Heritage Lottery Fund, Young Roots programme.

What is Crafting History?

Young People from Creative Collisions Youth Arts network will work with Norfolk Museums and Norfolk Arts & Library Services to set up and manage six, twelve week, craft residencies at Time & Tide Museum. Young People have identified craft skills that have contributed to the heritage of Great Yarmouth and which they feel still have the potential to inspire and engage their age group. They will help to select contemporary practitioners who are using the crafts in new and exciting ways and who also have a deep understanding of how their craft has been practiced traditionally. Practitioners will create original work inspired by museum collections and share their process directly with young people through master classes, workshops and, where practical, studio visits. Work produced by artists and young people will be exhibited at Time & Tide in summer 2017. The residency will happen throughout Oct/Nov/Dec 2015.

Townscape Heritage Initiative (UK)The next closing date for stage 1 applications to the Heritage Lottery Fund's (HLF) Townscape Heritage Initiative is 12 noon on the 1st September 2015. The Townscape Heritage Initiative is HLF's grant giving programme under which it supports schemes led by partnerships of local, regional and national interests that aim to regenerate the historic environment in towns and cities across the United Kingdom. The programme is designed to address problems in areas of particular social and economic need. The scheme is open to single organisations (such as Local Authorities) or partnerships of not for profit organisations and provides grants of between £100,000 and £2 million. If applicants receive a first-round pass, they will need to develop the scheme further within a 12-month development phase and then send a detailed second-round submission.

Reaching Communities (England)The Big Lottery Fund (BIG) is currently accepting applications to its Reaching Communities Programme. Reaching Communities provides grants of 10,000 upwards for up to 5 years for projects that help people and communities who are most in need, and can really make a difference. Reaching Communities can fund, salaries, running costs, a contribution towards core costs and equipment. BIG can also fund up to £100,000 for land, buildings or refurbishment capital costs. BIG want to fund projects that respond to needs identified by communities and those that fund projects that help those most in need including those people or groups who are hard to reach. Big Lottery Fund Launches £10 Million Big Potential Advanced Fund (England)

The Big Lottery Fund has launched the £10m Big Potential Advanced Fund. The new 'Advanced' Fund is an extension to Big Lottery Fund's existing investment readiness programme; Big Potential. The Advanced Fund will support organisations at a more advanced stage in their development, looking to raise larger investments of over £500,000 as well as win contracts over £1m. The new advanced route will be available to those that are clear about how social investment could work for them and can describe a potential deal or interest from investors and need help to close that deal. Grants of up to £150,000 will be available. The original £10m fund will continue, offering in-depth support and grants to organisations looking to raise smaller amounts of repayable investment of up to £500,000 that are at an earlier stage in their social investment journey. This existing support will now be delivered through the Breakthrough route of the programme which includes preliminary and investment plan grants up to £75,000.
