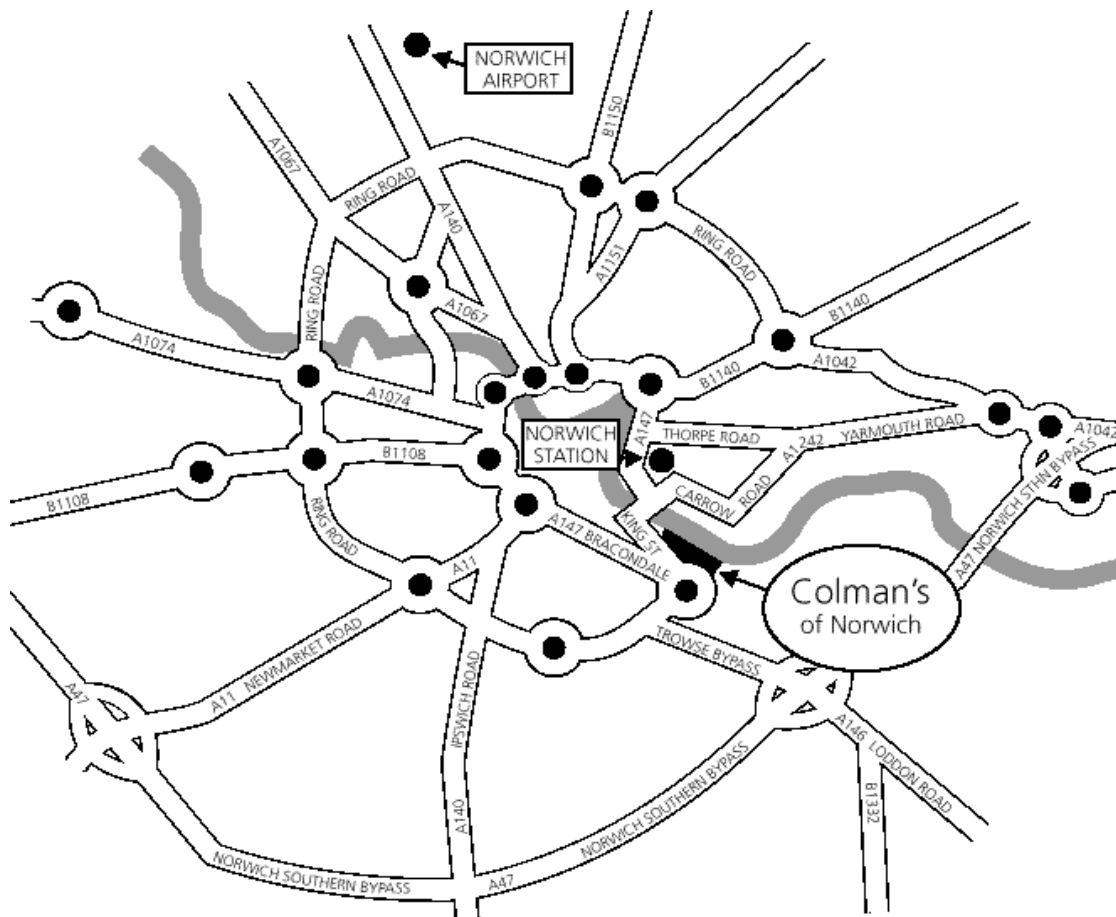

NB: The Abbey Conference Centre is situated within the grounds of Colman's Mustard Factory. Access is through the factory gates.

Please stop at the barrier and ask for directions to Sound Discovery training.



If approaching Norwich from the South or West join the A47, Norwich Southern Bypass, and head towards Great Yarmouth. Leave the bypass at A146 junction signed Trowse and County Hall. Follow the road for approximately three-quarters of a mile to a T-junction at which you turn right, and travel a further 300 yards to a roundabout. All site access is via the entrance directly across the roundabout and is signed "Works"
