Who are we?

The Norfolk Record Office collects and preserves unique archives relating to the history of Norfolk and makes them accessible to people in Norfolk and across the world. It includes the Norfolk Sound Archive.

School workshops

Workshops offer pupils a chance to use documents to find out how people in Norfolk were affected by local and national events throughout history. Workshops can take place at The Archive Centre or in your classroom.

All workshops at the Norfolk Record Office include a chance to see original documents from the period of your study. Often these workshops will include an introduction to document handling before the originals are looked at. Please note we are unable to bring original documents into your classroom.

Workshops are free of charge, and last approximately 2 hours, unless otherwise stated. However, they can be tailored to your school's needs.

Teaching resources

We have 2 types of teaching resources.

1. A variety of PDF teaching resources are available free of charge, on the 'Learning for All' pages of the NRO website:

The resources can be downloaded for use on a white board or printed out.

Most resources include: a teachers' notes section, information about the documents, and suggested activities using the material. Our history resources include transcripts to accompany the documents which have handwriting that is difficult to read.

2. We can also tailor make resources for each school. These cost £9.95 and can be provided as jpegs on a CD or as a laminated hard-copy pack.

Workshops North Norfolk Stories

Each workshop will help pupils explore the history of their town/ village. In both workshops, pupils will look closely at a census return to discover the people who lived in their village over 100 years ago. They will also use a trade directory to learn about trades practised in the area at that time, before using a map of the locality to go around the classroom collecting items from a shopping list relating to those trades.

Workshop 1 — What Changes Did the Railway Bring to North Norfolk?

Pupils will look at a variety of maps, sales particulars and accounts which demonstrate how the introduction of the railway brought increased tourism and a range of new jobs.

Workshop 2 — How did Living Near the Coast Affect People's Lives?

Pupils will study the fishing industry, see how the towns on the coast had an international trade from an early period, and look at some of the local leisure pursuits, such as regattas.

In the afternoon there is an opportunity to visit the

School Library Service which is next door to the Norfolk Record Office. The session will continue the local studies theme, with a story, carousel of related activities including a quiz, tour of the department and some simple research. Every pupil will be able to select and borrow a book from the large stock of specially chosen children's resources to take back to school.

Workshops run from 10am-2.30pm, with a morning and lunch break. However, we can tailor timings to suit your school's needs.

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Workshops (continued) First World War

In this workshop, which is suitable for a local history study, pupils will find out about people from Norfolk during the First World War and see our latest exhibition looking at the role of women during the war, including local nurse Edith Cavell. They will also complete two activities:

1. Draw a life-size solider using service records which may include details such as the soldier's height and chest size, distinguishing features, cap badge and medals.

2. Learn about Norfolk nurse Jessie Hayward, who was on board the SS Transylvania, which was carrying a large number of troops and nurses when it was torpedoed off the coast of Italy. Using Jessie's diary pupils will create a cartoon detailing the events from the moment the ship was hit, until Jessie was rescued from the choppy waters.

Tailor-made workshops

We have over 12 million documents which cover a wide range of periods and topics. Using these resources we are able to offer a range of tailor-made workshops.

These workshops usually take the form of an introduction to the Record Office by playing the indenture game, a chance to see some of the horrors that lurk in archives before they enter our building, a behind-the-scenes tour including a Strongroom, and a document handling session. The pupils then use our online catalogue to find documents relating to their topic using our online catalogue, and use these original documents to carry out their research.

Topics requested by schools last year included 'myths and legends' and 'Lord Nelson'.





Teaching Resources Local History

We can create a tailor made resource using documents relating to your school's local area, as part of a local history study. We'll choose 14 documents which will be sent to your school as an electronic pack in the form of jpegs on a CD, or as a laminated hard-copy pack. The images will reflect the history of the school's local area from the mid-19th to the mid-20th Centuries.

The Tudors

This resource can be used as part of a local history study, looking at how several aspects of national history are reflected in Norfolk. It looks at the differences between the lives of rich and poor people, demonstrating how local events, such as Kett's Rebellion,

impacted on a national level. In addition, the resource shows how national issues, such as plague, affected those living locally.

How were Norfolk People Effected by the Second World War?



This resource can be used in the study of a significant turning point in British History. The documents help pupils discover how the war affected local people, the lives of evacuees leaving and coming into Norfolk, and the effect of bombing on the county.

What Changes Happen to the Body in Flight?

This resource can be used in the study of the Year 6 topic: 'Animals including Humans'. The resource uses material from the archive of the 2nd Air Division Memorial Library held at the Norfolk Record Office, to concentrate on the lungs, heart and eardrums, and uncover the effects of different environments and pressures on the way the body functions.

How Can We Transport and Harness Water?

This resource can be used in the study of the Year 5 and 6 topic: 'Forces'. It can be particularly helpful in looking at the effects of water resistance and friction, and in studying mechanisms including levers, pulleys and gears. The resource concentrates on how water elevators and waterwheels work, including looking at pulley systems and using water for power.

Projects Creative Writing Competition

In Spring Term 2015 we ran a competition focusing on three diaries written during the First World War, which are now held in the archive. The diaries were written by a solider, nurse and church army worker. We asked young people to use these personal stories as inspiration to write something creative (such as a poem or short story).

We had some great entries for the competition, and selected Hope Owen Mcnair as the winner of the younger pupil category and Alex Good the winner of the older pupil category.

Hope's class visited The Archive Centre in May for their archival experience, whilst Alex's family enjoyed one of our Behind-the-Scenes tours.

History Workshops First World War

This workshop links with the topic: 'Challenges for Britain, Europe and the Wider World 1901 to the Present Day'. Pupils will view our exhibition about the role of women in the First World War, including local nurse Edith Cavell.

Pupils will examine the case of Philip Hewetson, an officer killed in France in 1918. Assessing the reliability of a range of

documents, pupils will consider his life in the trenches, and the inconsistencies in how his Missing In Action and death were reported by the War Office, a fellow patient, and in the newspapers.

Finally pupils will work in groups to create their own propaganda based on the death of Edith Cavell, using postcards created during the First World War as inspiration.

How was Norfolk Affected by Slavery?

This resource is useful for Key Stage 3 'Ideas, political power, industry and empire: Britain, 1745 -1901', focusing on Britain's transatlantic slave trade: its effects and its eventual abolition.

The resource will help pupils to understand the local connections to the transatlantic slave trade. It shows how Norfolk citizens both owned slaves, and also campaigned for the abolition of slavery.

How has Leisure and Tourism Changed in Norfolk and how can it be Shaped for the Future?




