Eco primary/ secondary school category requirements

Schools which have undertaken eco projects over the past 12 months, and are able to demonstrate their eco credentials. Projects could include, but are by no means limited to:

- Energy efficiency awareness and measures
- Sustainable use of school grounds for wildlife/ food production
- A school eco-council
- Many more innovative projects!

Successful schools will be to demonstrate that concern for the environment and sustainable living is at the heart of all they do.
