Summer 2016 will see the introduction of the new more challenging SPaG test for KS1 children. But teaching grammar at KS1 is about so much more than preparing children for a test. It is about giving children choice and control over their writing- so they can communicate what they want to say in the best way they can. This course explores how you can make learning grammar fun and teach it in a way which actually supports children to become better writers.

Using Debra Myhill's model of teaching grammar in a playful and contextual way, delegates will explore the national curriculum's grammar requirements and draw heavily from quality first texts to see how they can construct engaging sessions which build on children's understanding and interest. They will have an opportunity to consider how grammar can be woven into everyday English teaching and taught in a way which encourages children to apply their new found skills in their writing.

Outcomes:

- explore the Year1 and 2 programme of study
- engage in a range of playful and practical approaches that can be embedded in future planning;
- understand how grammar can be taught in a way which encourages children to apply their skills in writing
 - support preparation for the KS1 statutory assessment
