

SCITT Salaried: Part-time training route, 2016-2018

Would you like to become a Maths or Physics teacher but unable to commit to a full time training course?



What are the entry requirements?

- GCSE grade C or above in Maths and English
- A post GCSE qualification in Maths or Physics. This could include:
 - A level grade B or above in Maths or Physics and a willingness to undertake further study in these subjects
 - A degree which includes at least 30% Maths or Physics
- Some recent experience of visiting secondary schools and observing lessons.
- An enthusiasm for your subject and a desire to share this with pupils.

Our salaried part-time training route may make it possible for you to train alongside other commitments.

Our part-time training route is suitable for those who have childcare commitments or who wish to stage a career change over a two year period.

This training route is offered by Farlingaye and Kesgrave Teaching School Alliance in partnership with Suffolk and Norfolk Initial Teacher Training.

How is the course structured?

- Year one: Normally three days per week. One day in core training and two days in your placement school. You will gradually build up your teaching experience under the supervision of an experienced teacher. In the course of the year, you will gain some experience in a second school.
- Year two: Three days per week. You will spend most of your time in school with some further training days. You will teach your own classes for up to nine hours per week in your subject
- You will be supported by a school mentor and an external supervisor throughout the training period.







What will I earn?

- You will be paid a training salary of £21,000 (pro rata).
 - There are no tuition fees.
- Your salary and training will be funded by a government grant and a school contribution

Will I secure employment at the end?

- It is expected that those who complete the course will secure a teaching post.
- As a trainee in a shortage subject you should have the choice of a full time or part time post at the end of your training.
