

TA Toolkit: Good Questioning, Good Learning



Questioning is one of the key skills that support children's learning.

The course will examine the types of questions that can be asked in the classroom, and in small groups, and how these questions can be used to support effective learning.

The course will also explore how the development of a questioning environment further supports questioning for learning.

Delegates will explore why we ask questions and how these support thinking skills and consequent learning. The use of higher order questions for thinking will be examined in detail with opportunities for delegates to put into practical use. How the use of questioning can support detailed assessment for learning in an integral part of this course alongside developing children's own skills in asking questions to move their learning forward. Delegates will also be given some practical ideas for creating a classroom environment that supports good questioning.

- use Blooms taxonomy to be able to ask questions that promote 'higher order' thinking
- be equipped with a range of questions ready for use back in the classroom or small group setting
- use the training to be able to create a 'questioning' environment
- be able to apply questioning skills in the classroom or small group setting, to move pupils' learning forward
