

School Placements Needed for Swiss Trainee Teachers

NILE (Norwich Institute for Language Education) is a teacher training organisation based in Norwich, running courses for foreign teachers of English in methodology and language development.

NILE works with a lot of schools in the Norwich area, placing teachers and trainee teachers from a variety of countries with them for short placements.

This year a large group of Swiss trainee teachers will be here in **June**. They will be with NILE for a week, before doing an 8-day school placement. The placement is broken into 2 periods of 4 days each (Monday to Thursday in two consecutive weeks). This would mean a school taking one set of trainees for the first 4 days and another set for the second 4 days. They would have time between the placement blocks to brief each other on the schools, meaning that there should be a smooth handover. The dates are below.

Swiss trainee teachers	20-23 June 27-30 June	2 consecutive placements – trainees for 4 days and then a different set of trainees for 4 days.

NILE is looking for schools who are willing to take **2-6 trainees** on this programme. NILE is able to make a **contribution to your funds of £10 per trainee per day**, meaning £80 per trainee for the placement.
