Designed and facilitated by experienced school leaders and teachers, the Outstanding Teacher Programme gives good (and outstanding teachers) a set of skills and strategies that enable them to become consistently and sustainably outstanding. It helps them to:

- Demonstrate higher level understanding of teaching and improve learning for their pupils.
- Coach colleagues and pupils in their own school and in other schools to raise performance levels
- Create a proactive school culture where the quality of teaching and learning is observed, discussed, challenged and enhanced

There will be a combination of face-to-face workshops, 1-1 coaching and classroom observations of outstanding teaching as well as opportunities to work alongside colleagues from other schools which will include observation and evaluations in different settings. Delegates will focus on a range of aspects of teaching and learning such as challenge, engagement, assessment, differentiation, questioning & planning.

The Autumn programme is being organised and facilitated by Sheringham Primary Teaching School and being held at South Wootton Junior School, King's Lynn.



This programme helps teachers to:

- know the key concepts underpinning 'outstanding' practice in the classroom and understand the impact of these on 'outstanding' teaching & learning
- be able to model these concepts through consistently outstanding practice
- place a greater emphasis on the purpose and value of their lessons
- develop a specific vocabulary to describe & support the promotion of good/outstanding teaching & learning within own school setting
- create a school culture which promotes dialogue about pedagogy
- enhance their coaching and mentoring capabilities, to support and challenge colleagues to own and develop their personal practice
- use coaching strategies wherever possible as the preferred model to challenge and development.

Eligibility

This programme is open to teachers with the potential and capacity to consistently facilitate outstanding lessons. Applicants would need to demonstrate some of the following:

- strong commitment to teaching and learning and show that they are inspiring individuals with strong interpersonal skills and who are role models for pupils
- at least two years teaching experience of value added data showing student progress and improving results
- some external recognition that indicate that they have the ability to become outstanding teachers
- a commitment to professional development and the ability to truly reflect on their practice, including student feedback to evaluate the impact of their teaching
- An interest in developing a coaching ethos within their classroom and/or leading coaching within the school

IMPACT

The end result is a teacher who can reflect on their teaching, with the tools to enable raised levels of engagement in learning, through providing outstanding lessons. This includes placing greater emphasis on: the purpose and the value of their lessons; raising levels of engagement in learning; the use of different teaching styles to challenge learning; greater readiness to innovate and take risks; and more reflective planning.

Teachers will gain increased job satisfaction and opportunities for further leadership and career progression. They will become an innovative teacher who is willing to take risks.

OTP is a 9 week programme consisting of three full days, four 1/2 days and one & 1/2 days of in-school practice. The programme will be run and facilitated by Sheringham Primary Teaching School but will be held at South Wootton Junior School, King's Lynn.

- Attendance at all sessions
- Working in Learning Threes (L3S) for Planning, Observation & Presentation Delivery
- Group Feedback to each other and facilitators
- Define and implement own professional development targets against the Audit of Professional Skills
- Completion of the Post Session Challenges
- Adopt Coaching style where appropriate in own school
- Network across the cohort during and beyond OTP.
