## A KS3 day with Martin Fautley

Martin Fautley is a Reader in Education at Birmingham City University. For many years he was a school teacher in the Midlands before undertaking Doctoral research at the University of Cambridge. His research interests encompass theoretical and practical issues concerning creative processes in schools and how teachers can help foster these, and the ways in which assessment, particularly assessment for learning, can be used as means to raise standards.

Assessing music without national levels of attainment can seem a daunting prospect. Martin is a national expert on assessment in music and will offer some really practical advice within a sound intellectual framework.

- To understand how assessment without levels can be made a normal part of their classroom work in music education
- To understand the connection between curriculum planning, delivery and assessment.
- To consider how to reflect on assessment data with their pupils and how such data has been acquired
