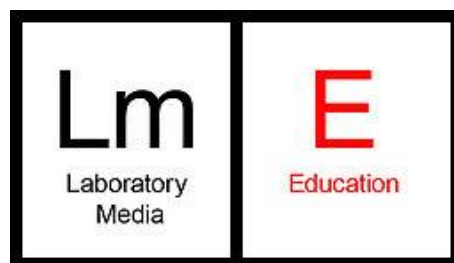


As part of the Norwich Gaming Festival 16 The Forum are offering schools (KS2) the opportunity to get involved with a project challenge before the festival starts.

Working in school with Laboratory Media Education, create your very own games controller using a Makey Makey board, some cardboard, some foil, some tape and your imagination!

You will create a device that will move in all directions and operate action buttons. It will be your design and will fit to your way of playing games.

Make it however you like – Big, small, long, star-shaped or spherical. Base it on an old joystick or SNES controller or be inspired by the Sega, Xbox or Playstation style controllers.

Build, test, tweak, play, demo.

Remember you don't have to control games with just your hands!!!
