I hope the story book will be an enjoyable resource for teachers to 'read out loud' to their classes as part of their introduction/follow up about Edith Cavell, and that it will enhance the children's knowledge and understanding of her story.


The delicate ending to the story, when Edith dies, can be difficult to approach with upper KS1 and KS2 pupils. This is why I have introduced the character of Jack, Edith's dog. He was part of her work during WW1 and she mentioned him a lot in letters and diary notes. Jack's response to losing his best friend will I hope assist teachers and help them explore R.E. syllabus/spiritual development concepts about what Christians believe about death/eternal life/Jesus. There are many social, moral, cultural and spiritual links to be made throughout. The book's content is as close as can be to Edith's biography.

Many schools have already taken part in our 'Edith Cavell Revealed' guided visit with classroom workshop about hospitals/Nightingale & Seacole here at the cathedral. They meet Edith, explore

the building with her and hear her story—and they meet Jack in puppet form! It fulfils many R.E. and History learning outcomes.
