What have we been up to with children...?

As part of the **North Norfolk Stories** project we have welcomed children to County Hall (oh, the risk assessment!). Three schools have brought children to the Norfolk Record Office and the SLS base for activities focused around the history of their local area, involving trains and using our Victorian toys as well as practising basic research skills and having the chance to borrow some of our lovely books.

We have also been busy at Norwich Castle where schools had

a wonderful morning at a Cressida Cowell '**How to Train your Dragon**' event and the **Peter's Book of the Year Norfolk SLS party** in the afternoon. Children decorated ruined wedding cakes (it woz the witch wot dun it), produced mini dramas using pirate speak, and were quizzed on their knowledge of the shortlisted books before voting for their favourites. Our Norfolk winner was 'How to Fight a Dragon's Fury' by Cressida Cowell, but the official winner of the Peter's Book of the Year award for Junior Fiction was 'How to Fly with Broken Wings' by Jane Elson.

The BBC also has exciting plans to complement the national celebrations, and remember to sign up for free resources every year - there is an annual Shakespeare Week <u>shakespeareweek.org.uk</u>

In Norfolk visit any public library to pick up a title from the 'Shakespeare Rewritten' collection this year's Great Big Read. In April the Maddermarket Theatre in Norwich will be running its own mini Shakespeare festival. This site has added relevance as St John's Maddermarket, just opposite the theatre, is where Shakespeare's fellow actor Will Kemp ended his Nine Days Wonder dancing from London to Norwich by leaping over the churchyard wall. Also look out for the Norwich Theatre Royal hosting a very special touring production of A Midsummer Night's Dream, using professional RSC actors as well as local people. <u>http://www.dream2016.org.uk/</u>

There is lots to look forward to, including a new Young Adult (YA) title from the wonderful Malorie Blackman. Out in April, it is called Chasing the Stars and is based on Othello. A science fiction take on the themes of the play, it sounds original and powerful.
