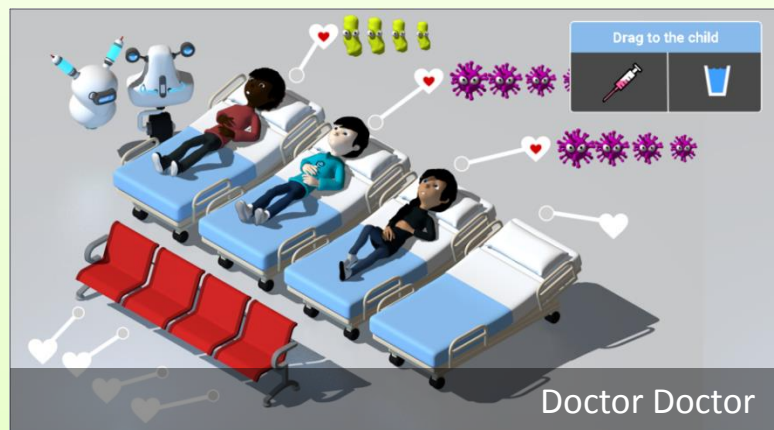
New e-Bug website!

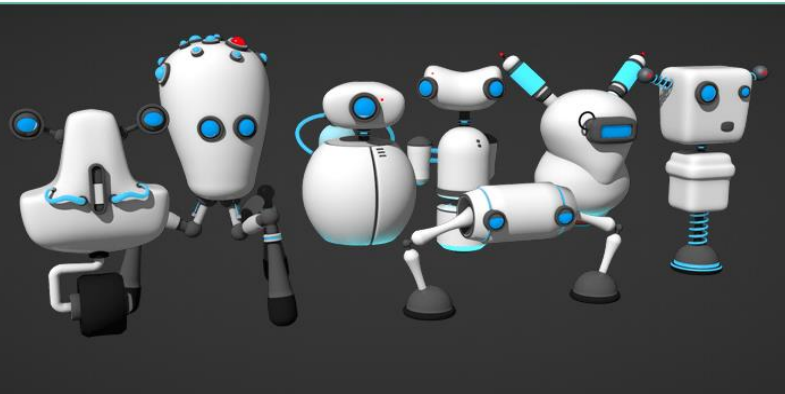

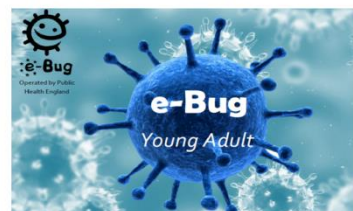
