

Primary English Toolkit: Reluctant Writers

What can we do to inspire and motivate boys and other reluctant writers, which will also benefit the other children in your class?

Course Outline

Both national data and recent research continues to show that boys are not only at a greater risk of under-performing in writing than girls, but that they are also less likely to enjoy writing. Based on the evidence available for what works with boys and other reluctant writers, this course will give delegates the opportunity to consider and reflect upon their own practice as well as explore practical approaches to motivating children to write. Delegates will engage in a range of transferable activities to inspire writing and have the chance to enjoy 'boy friendly' texts and resources such as film, images, objects, drama, ICT and more!

By the end of the course participants will:-

- understand key approaches to motivating reluctant writers
- be equipped with practical ideas and activities to use in the classroom
- understand how to use resources effectively to motivate reluctant writers.
