Workshops and speakers

Host School The Open Academy provides an extremely wide range of responsibilities where students can develop their leadership, teamwork skills and confidence. They also provide a range of opportunities from an annual residential visit to the chance to participate in a range of performances and foreign visits.

The Open Academy uses Eco-Schools as a framework for driving the specialism which in turn has driven student engagement and beyond that, academic success. Membership of the Green Team enables students to acquire experience of responsibility right from their arrival at the Academy. It means that students do not need to wait until they are in the older years to develop their leadership skills. It has helped the Academy to increase its percentage of students with a position of responsibility from 3% to 33% in four years and has produced youngsters who will be in the running for more senior prefect roles.

Eco-Schools has also enabled the Academy to integrate more with the community, in joint projects with local charities such as the allotments with BUILD and Age UK. It has also provided a focus for business links. It has also reinforced internally and with the wider community the importance that the Open Academy places on an education that is broader than merely collecting certain authorised exam results

Host organisation Anna Portch is Coordinator of Eco-Schools England at Keep Britain Tidy and will facilitate the event. Anna joined the Eco-Schools team in August 2015 and has worked in Environmental and sustainability Education for over 15 years. Anna has previously coordinated LEEF (London Environmental Education Forum) and FACE (Farming and Countryside Education) in London. As well as developing and delivering "Environmental Educator" training at the Cass School of Education, University of East London. Previously she was the Sustainable Schools Officer at Croydon Council working on Energy Saving and supporting schools with Eco-Schools.
