The reports that have this additional level of consolidation are the Balance Sheet, AR Report, Assets Report and Department Report. This will provide academy leaders with an extra layer of reporting in order to meet the ever changing requirements of academy finance.

Whole Class Ensemble Teaching (WCET) in Norfolk schools

Norfolk Music Service is pleased to be offering Whole Class Ensemble Teaching in at least 84 schools in Norfolk this academic year. This equates to approximately a total of 4000 pupils benefitting from learning an instrument each week, many of them for the first time.

WCET is led by highquality music teachers who develop musical skills in schools on a wide range instruments and singing, that can be applied in National Curriculum music lessons as well as providing a useful CPD opportunity for the class teachers and assistants to learn from each other. Whole Class Ensemble Teaching



has been shown to positively affect the self-worth, the organisation skills, the confidence and the musical development of the children involved.

Currently the instruments taught in schools include strings, brass, percussion, woodwind, ukulele, ocarina, recorder and classical guitar. Many pupils have thrived in their WCET lessons and many choose to continue learning to play an instrument after their first year of the WCET programme. Pupils also benefit from extra-curricular workshops and performances, organised and supported by Norfolk Music Service throughout the year, including large-scale celebration events across the county in the final term, and other performance opportunities nationwide.

Schools can enter their WCET groups into the Norfolk County Music Festival, for which applications open on 3 October and the festival runs from 27 February - 10 March 2017. More information on Norfolk County Music Festival can be found at www.norfolkmusic.org.uk.

Bright Futures at Holt Hall Environmental and Outdoor Learning Centre

'Bright Futures' is a 2 ½ day residential programme at Holt Hall exploring sustainable energy, environmental engineering, and science communication. Holt Hall hosts day and residential events for schools and community groups. The Centre is a hub of expertise around outdoor pedagogy, skills-building, and sustainable employability.





Recently *Bright Futures* brought students, energy engineers, and university researchers mentors from four countries together to build their teambuilding, communication. and technical skills. During the programme, students produced a short educational film exploring energy science and policy, partnered with a local company to explore eco-buildings and electric car technologies, and developed an action plan for a local environmental campaign.



Students also participated in a university-style biodiversity statistics seminar, studied local ecological patterns, and engaged in a young people's consultancy session.

Health, Safety and Well-Being

Relationship issues are one of the most common reasons for employees contacting Norfolk Support Line, the confidential counselling and advice service provided by Norfolk County Council. When those relationship issues are between work colleagues in a school, the impact can spread to their colleagues, pupils, and even parents. However, one measure that has helped people resolve issues and move on is dispute resolution, a service NCC has been providing since 2014.

The service is provided by HR and well-being staff who received training from CEDR. a highly respected organisation in this field. The process of dispute resolution focuses on the future and rebuilding relationships, rather than apportioning blame for what went wrong. It is similar to mediation, but less formal. The process is voluntary, collaborative and looks for solutions that are mutually acceptable. At the end of the process the employees will complete a written agreement, which they share with their manager, detailing how they are going to rebuild their relationship.

The process has been taken up by a number of schools already, with the great majority of cases resulting in a successful conclusion. Feedback obtained 3 months after the dispute resolution indicates the impact was sustained. Managers reported improved levels of work, a reduction in absence, reduced management time and better morale across the wider team.
